At lunch one day on Staten Island he saw a LARGE table of soldiers just ordering their food. He quietly pulled the waiter to his table and asked that he receive the check for ALL of the soldiers and asked specifically that his identity not be revealed.

Our recipient is Jewish...but learning that during the Christmas Holiday a Catholic Church had a collection box for the homeless stolen with over \$500.00 lost...in the spirit of unselfishness and love he wrote a check for \$500 and delivered it to the Church.
